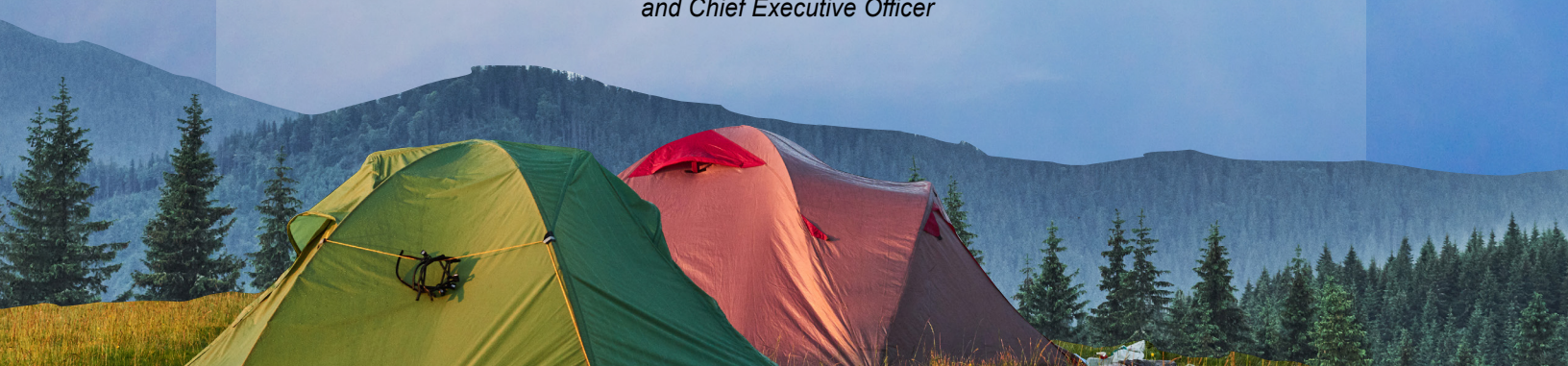

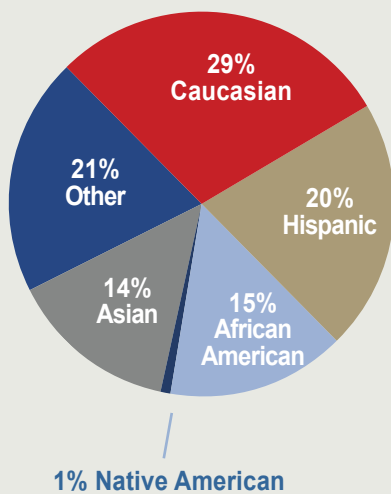
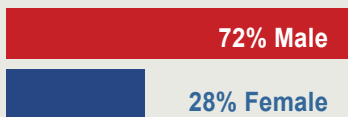

Program Highlights



Cub Scout Summer Camp

Our loyal supporters and 2,900 dedicated volunteers worked hard to make a difference for over 8,000 youth across the five boroughs of New York City.

GNYC steps in to offer afterschool, career development, and outdoor adventure programs support by providing both staffing and programming with a track record for success. In many instances, our programming may be the only extracurricular services offered to that young person, many of whom lack critical community support. We build a network of community to help kids to become leaders. We are proud that our Council reflects a diverse community of New Yorkers, with 85% of our Scoutreach and Exploring students identifying as Black/African American and Latinx.

We are inspired by our youth participants, donors, partners, volunteers, and staff who rose to meet pandemic challenges and demonstrated a steadfast commitment to bringing our programming back. We could not have had the nearly 17% growth in membership in 2022 without all of you.

I. Scoutreach

Using a unique delivery model, we use paid trained program leaders to serve as mentors to deliver a Cub Scouting weekly program in public schools.

Scoutreach grew substantially this year. We opened six additional after-school programs and membership increased by 32%!

With today's youth under tremendous stress, this program is needed now more than ever. Our Program Specialists are trained mentors as well as teachers.

Principal Thomas Guarnieri, another longtime Scoutreach partner, explained that teaching children to respect one another helps reinforce a safe and thriving learning environment for all students and school employees. While character education is not taught in the school curriculum, our Cub Scouts program fills that gap. When it comes to promoting safety and nonviolence, he explained, *"it's all about respect!"*

II. Volunteer-Led Scouting

Our traditional Packs and Troops follow the BSA advancement curriculum featuring character education, outdoor adventure, and leadership skills. We do this by partnering with schools and with faith-based and community-based organizations throughout the city who host programs with us in every neighborhood in New York City. Scouting teaches lifeskills such as teamwork and leadership, as well as a wide variety of other important and exciting subject areas that prepare them for success in life. Career exploration, cyber safety, first aid, swimming, disaster preparedness, cooking, and financial literacy are just some of the areas that Scouts can learn in our programs.

Cub Scouts: Cub Scouts serves children in kindergarten through fifth grade. The Cub Scout motto is “do your best.” Children meet weekly for activities with other Cub Scouts and family members, where we emphasize learning and being part of a team while having fun.

Scouts BSA: For older youth ages 11-18, we offer weekly meetings with frequent camping trips and other outdoor adventure activities integrated with a comprehensive advancement program. Scout leaders emphasize developing self-confidence, project management, service, and leadership skills. The youth-led program and more than 120 merit badge programs offer unparalleled development opportunities for older youth.

Older youth can also participate in Sea Scouts and Venturing programs.

Both volunteer-led and paid program leader-led Scouting programs can significantly impact the future for a child. Scouts are TWICE as likely to get a bachelor’s degree and TWICE as likely to get an advanced degree. Most Scouts come from low-income families and are more likely to make almost DOUBLE the personal income as their non-Scout peers with similar backgrounds.

For school-age children, Scouting participation was associated with lower school truancy, lower rates of suspension and greater improvement in their math and English Language Arts proficiency when compared to their non-Scout peers.

III. Exploring

This co-educational program serves New York City students ages 14-20, delivering a worksite-based transition program with professional mentors to help young people succeed in college and career.

Law Enforcement Exploring: we offer Posts in every NYPD precinct and at other agencies such as the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the Metropolitan Transit Authority (MTA).

Career-based Exploring: enables young people to learn about a variety of career sectors including Finance, Construction, Healthcare, Law, and Hospitality. Many Explorers participate in multiple posts throughout the year to see what field is most aligned with their interests. We offer posts in a variety of career fields with partners such as:

We offer Law Enforcement Posts at every precinct in the NYPD, and also with the FBI, MTA, and Customs and Border Protection and other law enforcement partners. Law Enforcement Exploring held its annual summer Academy at Villa Maria Academy for two weeks, followed by a week at our Camp Keowa in upstate New York. Our partners at the NYPD, FBI, and more joined forces to make this an invaluable experience for our Explorers. Police Commissioner Sewell was joined by many other top law enforcement leaders at her first trip to Camp Keowa.

Explorers conducted dozens of service projects throughout the city all year long, investing over 64,000 hours into our community, from emergency food distribution for seniors to graffiti removal.

62% of our Exploring Alumni report now having a primary job in the career field of their Exploring post.

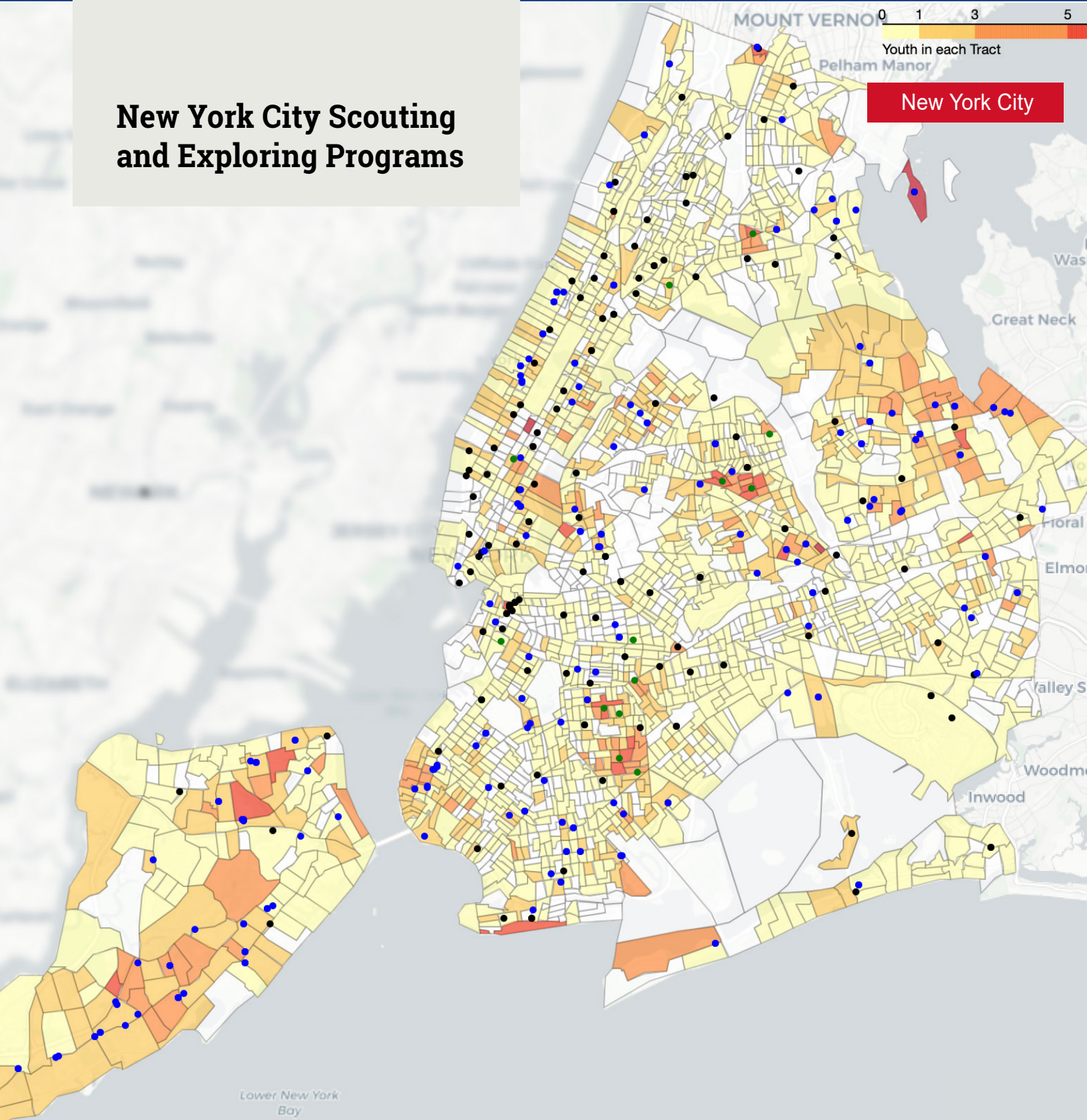
SPOTLIGHT ON

IV. Outdoor Adventure and Camping

Children in New York City have few opportunities to stay active and experience nature. At a time when many kids are spending more time on computers and other electronic devices, Scouting encourages youth to get outside and play together. The disruptions and continued challenges of the pandemic make outdoor adventure and the chance to just be a kid even more meaningful.

The Greater New York Councils owns and operates three nationally recognized camp facilities:

- Alpine Scout Camp, located in New Jersey on 400 acres just 10 minutes from the George Washington Bridge, hosts the John E. Reeves Cub World, which offers weeklong camping experiences for 6-10 year old boys and girls. Cub World offers indoor and outdoor climbing facilities, a large swimming pool, a baseball field, a game room, and a technology center.

- Ten Mile River Scout Reservation is in Narrowsburg, NY. The Reservation offers swimming, sailing, canoeing, rowing, a pool, a high ropes team-building course, three climbing towers, and terrain that provides hiking, mountain biking, rock climbing, and rappelling opportunities. Throughout the year its winterized facilities play host to weekend trips and it hosts multiple resident summer camps.

- William H. Pouch Scout Camp is centrally located in Staten Island on 120 acres and is used for day trips and weekend outings year-round with archery, a fully stocked lake, hiking trails, picnic groves, a playground, and sports fields.

A high percentage of leaders reported improvements among their Scouts in essential life skills as a result of attending summer camp:

- Leadership:** 94%
- Responsibility:** 95%
- Resilience:** 94%
- Teamwork:** 94%
- Communication:** 92%
- Self-esteem:** 92%

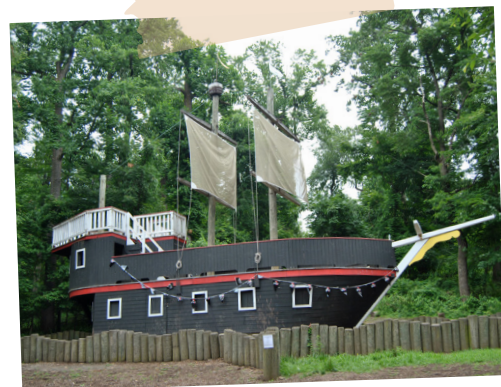
And 97% agreed that the summer camp advancement activities help the Scouts be better prepared academically for the school year to come.

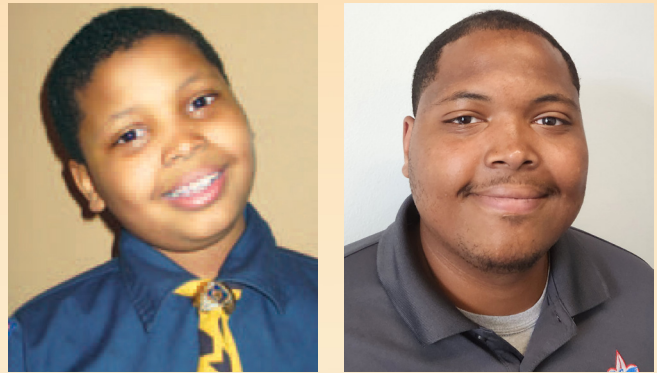
SPOTLIGHT ON

Colby Broaddus, Scoutreach alumnus

It was an exciting year in camping, as we welcomed thousands of young people for outdoor adventure and fun family programs at our three properties for summer camp and throughout the year. Whether they were there to make friends, learn new skills, or earn merit badges, Scouts and Explorers challenged and surprised themselves in new ways.

Scoutreach and Exploring alumnus Colby Broaddus has seen this firsthand from a variety of perspectives. He joined the Scoutreach program in first grade in Washington Heights, became a camp counselor-in-training at age 15 and also joined the Exploring program.

“Scouting, in many ways, helped save me. As a 15 year-old boy growing up in Washington Heights, it is very easy to get involved in the wrong crowd and become a victim to the streets. However, the Scouting and Exploring programs of the Greater New York Councils helped to keep me focused on positive things and kept me busy by giving me the opportunity to learn new and useful skills — including CPR, first-aid, swimming, wilderness survival, and how to stop crime in my community.”

While working on staff at Alpine Scout Camp, Colby trained two dozen counselors each year to mentor young people who come from similar circumstances to fulfill their dreams for life, and is now a District Executive in Scoutreach in the Garden State Council.

He attests to the power of summer camp among participants. The greatest impact that he has seen from the program over his years as a participant and a staff leader is in building the belief of the participants in themselves, that they can do whatever they set their minds to accomplish: “We show the kids confidence.” Whether it is learning to swim or climbing to new heights, camp helps youth build self-esteem.

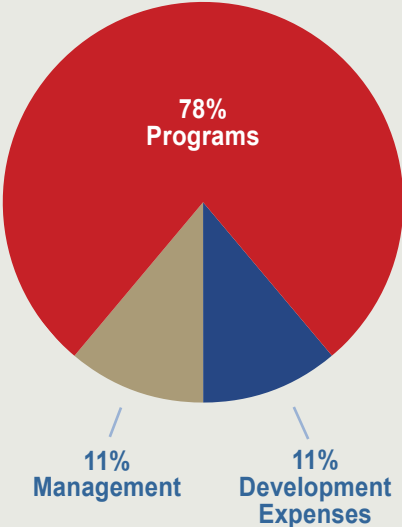

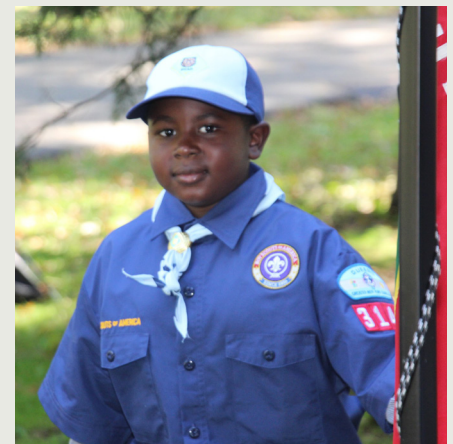
